ANNUAL REPORT 2010

Dear Friends of the Kitchens and Pantry,

The deep and continuing recession that has affected all of us has been particularly devastating for the poor and homeless. Without our services, it is difficult to imagine where our guests would go for food and water or how the community would be affected by our absence. Thanks to your support of our mission, we have been able to continue our organization's long history of serving the poor and homeless in an environment of respect, care, and hospitality.

2010 was another year of increasing demand for our services. We served 212,666 meals at the two Kitchens, an increase of 17.8% over 2009 and 27.6% more than in 2008. With your support, we also distributed groceries and toiletries at the Pantry to a total of 9,782 individuals or families.

As the weak economy sent many more people to our doors, we faced much greater expenditures for food and less funding from donors and foundations. We appreciate the in-kind support from food and supply donors, who significantly helped defray program expenses. In 2011, we will work to increase donations, increase funding, and maintain basic reserves to meet the continuing high demand at both Kitchens and the Pantry.

Our large and loyal network of volunteers is critical to our efforts. Our volunteers devote their time and talent providing whatever is needed to keep our doors open and our operating expenses at a minimum. We celebrate each one of them!

Each day, we are reminded by our guests that they rely on and truly appreciate our services. Among our guests, we see the working poor, the mentally ill, the elderly poor, and those who are homeless. We seek to meet their basic human needs for food and water, thereby improving their quality of life.

We are grateful for the opportunity to look back at the year and give heartfelt thanks to our volunteers, donors, employees, and Board of Directors for their commitment to care for the poor.

Just as our guests rely on us, we rely on YOU!

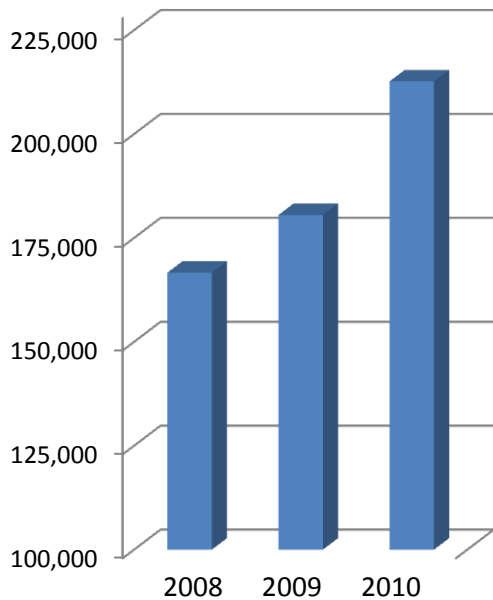

## **OPERATIONS AND FACILITIES**

- Patricia Wakim, Executive Director, served as Interim Manager of the Over-The-Rhine Kitchen until a full time replacement can be hired.
- Melody Byrom, Manager of the Walnut Hills Kitchen and Walnut Hills Pantry, continued to manage both facilities, as well as coordinate volunteer activity, communicate with food/supply donors, and solicit new food/supply donations. Melody also provided weekend support at the Over-The-Rhine Kitchen in 2010.
- Weekend Warriors received safe food handling training, volunteer-staff process improvements, and extended orientation/training for new Weekend Warrior groups.
- Our quarterly newsletter, *Kitchen Bites and Pantry Delites*, periodic email blasts, and our website provided critical communication links with our volunteers and donors. To save printing and mailing costs and to increase communication effectiveness, we continued our efforts to transfer more subscribers to email. Many thanks to the following volunteers who continued in 2010 to assist our communications efforts:

- The employee manual for the Kitchens and Pantry staff was significantly updated to incorporate best practices to ensure our staff is held to high standards and is well trained for their work with guests, volunteers, donors, and vendors.
- Construction work continued through 2010 for the new offices and flexible meeting space at the Walnut Hills Kitchen and Pantry. This project is critical as it will allow hiring and supervision of a development/administrative assistant, will reduce the need to find borrowed meeting room space, and will allow staff to have co-located offices. We thank volunteers from General Electric, MI & ES Aviation, who have volunteered their time, materials, and labor in completing this three year endeavor. We celebrate the commitment of GE to the completion of this project amidst the on-going demands of their business. A special thank you goes to project manager Dave Yates who integrates the volunteers and work. General Electric employees have truly lived out their corporate values to “demonstrate a tireless personal commitment to work together and deliver

great outcomes for communities in need.” Beyond construction, GE volunteers from Corporate Counsel, Aviation MC& IA, and Aviation Sales/Marketing have also participated with the Kitchens and Pantry by organizing food drives, delivering food, stocking Pantry shelves, bagging groceries for the Pantry, and preparing and serving meals. We look forward to the formal opening of the Walnut Hills multipurpose office space in 2011!

- For improved safety and security for staff, volunteers, and guests, a flood light was installed in the shared driveway of the Over-The-Rhine Kitchen.
- The Over-The-Rhine Kitchen also improved and rerouted furnace ducting to reduce waste and improve kitchen heating in winter. Our volunteers are no longer getting chilly and storage areas are no longer overheating, saving energy.
- The Walnut Hills Pantry began its transition from paper recordkeeping to electronic record keeping for tracking pantry eligibility forms and guest signatures at each visit. While this may seem ordinary in 2010, the Walnut Hills Pantry is only the second pantry in Ohio to adopt electronic record keeping. The software creators, Dan Roth and Bill Pitzer, donated the software and were present for the launch, along with a representative from the Freestore Foodbank. Both electronic and manual records were maintained simultaneously for the 2010 fiscal year in order to assist with necessary software updates and to verify accurate recordkeeping.

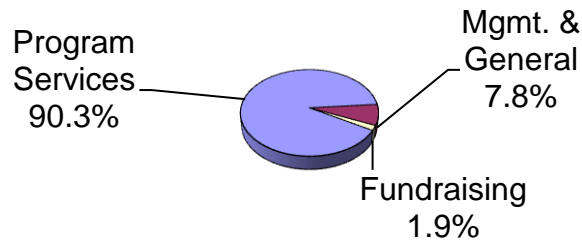

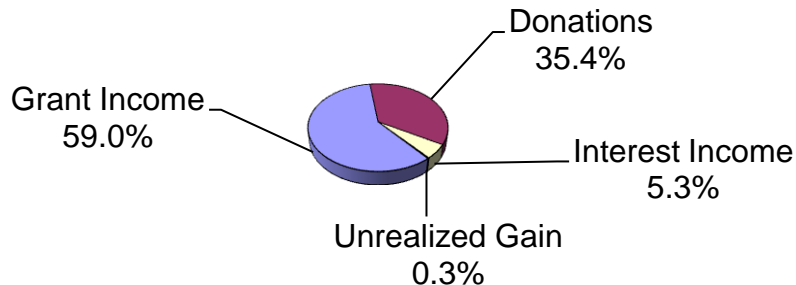

**Overview**

We celebrated 2010, an incredibly difficult year, because we NEVER had to turn away a hungry person from our doors. In total, the Kitchens served 17.8% more meals in 2010 – a significant increase, requiring greater expenditures for food at a time where our donors were not able to provide as many cash donations. Fundraising was increased slightly to solicit additional donors. Grant funding continued to be more difficult to obtain due to the tight economy, but many granters were able to support our work. In-kind support from food and supply donors significantly helped defray program expenses and allowed us to continue our mission to serve the poor. In 2011, we hope to increase donations and maintain basic reserves as we foresee a continuation of high demand at both kitchens and the pantry.
